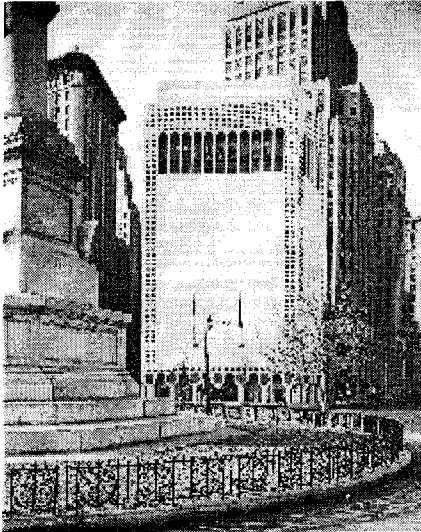

'THREATENED'!

The September/October 2003 issue of Preservation, the Magazine of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, hits newsstands across the country this week. Featured on page 12 is photographer Ezra Stoller's iconic image of 2 Columbus Circle (ESTO 1964, above), with a caption reading:

"THREATENED: **1964 Two Columbus Circle**, New York City: designed by Edward Durell Stone as gallery for art collection of A&P heir Huntington Hartford, considered for extensive exterior changes by prospective owner, Museum of Arts and Design."

This item shares the page with other historic buildings labelled "SAVED," "LOST," and "RESTORED." A growing number of people across the nation are asking, Which will it be for 2 Columbus Circle?

The responsibility for protecting this building, which the National Trust has called "a nationally recognized local landmark," rests with the New York Landmarks Preservation Commission, which has yet to hold a public hearing to consider making 2 Columbus Circle an official NYC Landmark.
