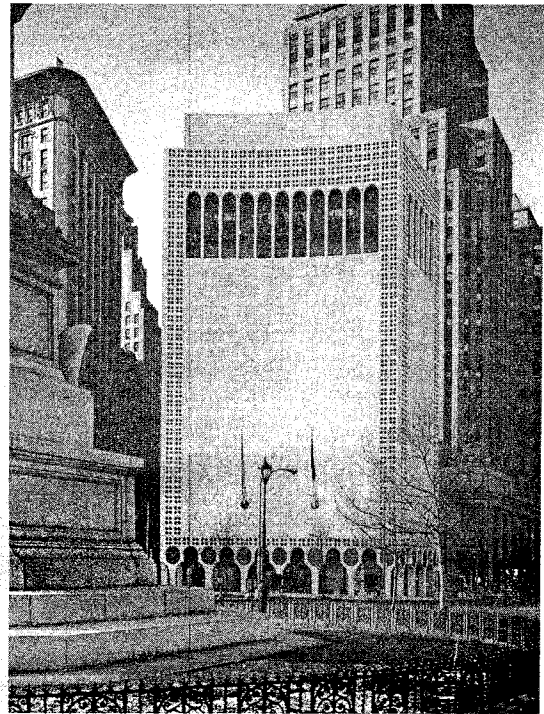

WE THINK 2 COLUMBUS CIRCLE DESERVES A LANDMARKS HEARING
